It is with great sadness that the family of Charles Edward Inglangasak (Lennie) announces his passing on Friday, November 6, 2020 in Inuvik.

Edward Lennie was born in the Husky Lakes area on June 23, 1934 the youngest child of Sarah Kyikavikchik (Kay) and Lennie Inglangasak. His mother Sarah was Gwich'in from Old Crow, who came from a historical line of Gwich'in leaders, his father Lennie was a renowned leader among the Inuvialuit as a Bankslander with great skills navigating his schooner to Banks Island, Herschel Island and the mainland.

He married Jenny Ekaksak (the love of his life who he lost when she passed away in 2012). They had 9 children, Dennie-deceased (Barb),

Johnny (Beverly), Anita (Steve), Peter-deceased, Nadine (Jan Peter), Hans (Billie), Henry Firth (Erin), Noel-deceased, and Norman-deceased.
