Doug was a true Northerner who spent his adult life in the North, working for the federal government in Baker Lake, Hall Beach and Iqaluit before settling down in Cambridge Bay, NU. Doug was a respected senior manager with Municipal and Community Affairs, and then with the Government of Nunavut's Community and Government Services until his retirement. He continued his public service after retirement, representing the Kitikmeot on the Environmental

Monitoring Advisory Board for the Diavik Mine. Doug loved living in the Kitikmeot and connected deeply with the land and the people. He was known for his love of hockey and was a skilled player in his day. He was most at home at his cabin near Mount Pelly, fishing at Kitigak and Ferguson Lakes, and running his dogs.

Doug leaves behind his beloved partner Anna, son Matt, and stepson Ian (wife Amanda and their children Lance, Hazel and Joel) who, along with his many friends across the North, mourn his passing and will miss him deeply.
