Gary was an avid sports fan. He played ball passionately and spent hours practicing his swing by batting rocks into Lake Temagami. He played hockey throughout his life and wore #11 with pride for his college team The HSM Miner's. He was an avid Habs fan throughout his life. Gary also enjoyed golfing and when he wasn't playing sports he was watching it on TV. He shared his love of sports with his son Zachary and coached his soccer, ball and hockey teams.



Gary loved to be outdoors on the land. Fishing, hunting, walking in the bush, going for a boat ride or just sitting and enjoying the beauty of the Mother Earth were his favourite pastimes.

Gary is survived by his loving wife, Nancy; daughter, Kimberly; son, Zachary; father, Gary Sr.; brother, Dean (Linda); and sisters, Elizabeth and Paula. Gary was
