Stephan died in Hay River on February 27, 2021. He will be dearly missed by his wife, Christine, daughters, Ilona and Julia, sister Eszter Schwenke and brother-in-law Jülf, niece Andrea Schwenke Wyile and her two daughters, and sister-in-law Margrit Gyapay (predeceased by his brother Csaba Gyapay).
