

**BECKET, Gordon B.** of Yellowknife, N.W.T. died peacefully on December 13, 2004 at the age of 60. Gord is survived by his sister, Diane, his two daughters, Jennifer and Chrissy, his niece, Suzanne, his nephew, Stephen (Sheri), their children Kendra and Tyler, his numerous friends, colleagues as well as all the fish he was not able to catch.

Gord was born on October 24, 1944 in Toronto, Ontario.

After completing school, he began his career in the occupation health and safety field at RIO Algam Mines.

He then worked for Central Canada Potash in Saskatchewan. In 1979, Gord moved to Cassiar, B.C. and worked for the Cassiar Mining Corporation and was the fire chief of the town's fire department.
